# Descendants of Robert Dodgson

#### Generation No. 1

**1.** ROBERT<sup>1</sup> DODGSON died in Paythorne. He married ELLEN BROWNE June 6, 1633 in Long Preston, daughter of JOHN BROWNE and MARGARET. She was born in Paythorne, and died in Paythorne.

#### Notes for ROBERT DODGSON:

Will of Robert Dodgson - In the name of God, Amen. The third day of March 1676 I Robert Dodgson of Paythorne in the parish of Gisburn and the county of York yeoman being sick in body and whole in mind but of perfect remembrance God be Praised. I do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner and form following. First and principally I committ and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Maker hoping by the Passion and Merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour to have free pardon and full remission of all my sins and my body to be buried in the parish church of Gisburn aforesaid at the discretion of my friends. Now as touching my worldly estate I disose thereof as followeth. And first my will and mind is that John Dodgson my eldest son shall have the land that I had by my wife and the tenement holden by lease under Mr. Walmsley after my wife's decease. I will he shall have that in case he join with her at paying of the fine (sic). Item I give to my son Robert Dodgson all the land that I bought off Henry Hewitt and that I bought off Richard Trotter and likewise I give to my son Robert £40 in money. Item I give to Margaret and Ellen Dodgson daughters of Christopher Dodgson to whom I am grandfather either of them 50 shillings a year giving a lawful discharge to the executors for the same. Item I give to George and Ellen Wilkinson son and daughter of William Wilkinson of Horton Hall deceased to whom I am grandfather either 50 shillings a year giving a lawful discharge to the executor for the same. Item I give to Ann, Ellen, Alice and Margaret Wilkinson daughters of William Wilkinson of Nappa Flats £20 to be equally divided amongst them giving a lawful discharge to the executors for the same. Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Richard Brown £7. Item I give to my son John Dodgson all my husbandary gear. Item I give to Ellen my wife all the reversion of my personal estate whatsoever after any just debts and funeral expenses be paid. And lastly I do ordain and make Ellen Dodgson my wife my sole executrix of this my last will and testament.

The above named Robert Dodgson did this day and year above said expressed and declared those words above mentioned or words to the same effect being then of perfect memory to be his last will and testament.

So who was this Robert? It is tempting to think that he is the Robert baptised in 1605 at Gisburn, but another Robert Dodgson will from around the same time makes me think that this isn't the case. In the registers before the birth of Robert and Ellen's children, Dodgsons are usually referred to as "of Newsholme" or they have no place name ascribed to them. The only exception to this is the burial of the widow Dodgson of Paythorne dated 27th February 1614/5. The fact that she is called the widow Dodgson rather than being given a name or having her late husband's name mentioned makes me think that she had been a widow for quite some time and had perhaps long been referred to in that manner. Could she have been Robert's mother? I'm sure that Robert must tie in to the Newsholme Dodgsons but quite how is not yet clear. The early Gisburn registers are incomplete. It is interesting that the Newsholme Dodgsons seem to disappear from Gisburn. One, John, goes to Southfield in Colne but where do the others go? Subsequent Dodgsons in the Registers all descend from Robert and Ellen. In other records there is mention of a William Dodgson in Paythorne before Robert. Some information about him follows -

Note loan book of year 1522 shows William Dogeson as tenant to the abbot of Sawley for Paythorne. Also in 1524 and 1545 he is listed under Paythorne in the lay subsidy rolls. He is the only Dodgson listed in Paythorne.

Notes for ELLEN BROWNE: The Will of Ellen Dodgson

In the name of God, Amen. The 8th day of February 1681, I Ellen Dodgson of Paythorne in the County of York, widow, being sick of body but of perfect remembrance, praise be God for the same. I do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth. That is to say first and principally I do resign my soul into the merciful Hands of Almighty God my Creator assuredly hoping through the merits of my Blessed Saviour to obtain remision of all my sins and my body I commit to the earth from whence it came and to be decently buried by the discretion of my friends and executor hereinafter named, and for my worldy goods and estate the Lord has lent me, I dispose hereof as followeth:

Inprimis I give and bequeath to my oldest son John Dodgson 1 table and form, 1 long settle, 1 soiled chair and 1 fire range in the body stead of the house and likewise I give unto my son John Dodgson 1 Tester bed, 1 chest and 1 table in the parlour in the east end of the house also 1 arke and 1 pair of bed stocks in the chamber in the east end of the house and likewise 2 arkes and 1 pair of bed stocks in the chamber over the bodystead of the house. Item I give and bequeath to my son Christopher Dodgson 1 cow. Item I give and bequeath to my son Robert Dodgson half of the tenement holden by lease from Mr. Walmsley during the term of the lease in being. And likewise I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Dodgson all the reversion of my quick goods and likewise 1 great chest with all the bedding and clothes thereon standing in the chamber over the house and also I give and bequeth to my son Robert Dodgson 1 tester bed, 1 arke in the parlour chamber and 1 table and form thereto belonging, 1 cupboard with 5 best dishes thereon standing, 1 tester bed and 2 soiled chairs, 1 stone trough for holding water in the parlour in the west end of the house. Item I give and bequeath to Ann the wife of William Wilkinson of Nappa Flats £10 in money and for my apparel I give and bequeath to be equally divided amongst my three daughters that is to say Margaret Willcock, Ann Wilkinson and Elizabeth Brown. And then after my just debts be paid and discharged it is my will and mind that all the reversion of my bills, bonds and goods and chattles, reckonings and accounts whatsoever I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my two sons and two daughters that is to say Christopher Dodgson, Robert Dodgson, Ann Wilkinson and Elizabeth Brown. And lastly I do nominate and appoint my son Robert Dodgson sole executor of this my last will and testament revolking all other wills and testaments. And also I add to this my last will which I now make that I give and bequeath to Margaret Willcock my best chest standing in the parlour chamber.

**2.** CHRISTOPHER<sup>2</sup> DODGSON (*ROBERT*<sup>1</sup>) was born 1650 in Paythorne, and died January 1730/31 in Ellenthorpe, Gisburn. He married ELIZABETH SERGINSON July 17, 1673 in St. Mary's Gisburn, daughter of EDWARD SERGINSON and MARGARET DOBSON. She was born 1649 in Paythorne, and died February 1728/29 in Ellenthorpe, Gisburn.

#### Notes for Christopher Dodgson:

At Ellenthorp Farm there are two houses. One has a datestone above the door with the initials CD and the date 1679. Inside the CD is a larger E. Mirroring the pattern at Paa Farm and Windy Pike with Robert and Agnes Dodgson and Christopher and Agnes Lancaster respectively I believe this stone to have been placed by Christopher Dodgson and his wife Elizabeth above the door of what was then known as Ellingthorpe Grange. The various wills and memorials relating to this particular family are fascinating. In 1711, first son Robert is the heir apparent. By the time of his father's will in 1728 though things have obviously gone wrong between the two.

An indenture bearing dates 16th February AD 1711 between Christopher Dodgson of Ellinthrop within th township of Paythorne in the parish of Gisburn in the county of York yeoman on the one part and Robert Dodgson of Ellinthrop aforesaid son and heir apparent of the said Christopher Dodgson on the other part of and concerning all that messuage or dwelling house and barn and garden and stable and all those closes, closures or parcels of land called and known by the several name or names of the Croft, the Gatelands, the Nar Kill Flats, the Far Kill Flats, the Widow Ings, the Mossfields, the Kirlinows, the Castill Banks, the Great Mill Butts and the Little Mill Butts containing by rough estimation 30 acres of land be the same more or less and are situate, lying and being at Ellingthorpe within Paythorne aforesaid and are now in the tenure and occupation of the said Christopher Dodgson his assignes or assigns which said indenture is witnessed by Robert Dodgson of Pay, William Lancaster of Windy Pike and Mary Dodgson of Ellingthorpe all the three living within the township of Paythorne in the parish of Gisburn in the county of York and Robert Dodgson and William Lancasters additions are yeomen and Mary Dodgsons spinster.

Signed and sealed in the presence of us Robert Dodgson junior, the mark of Agnes Dodgson Robert Dodgson.

### Memorial registered 19th May 1721 at 12 noon

This indenture of lease and release bearing dates 7th and 8th days of December in th seventh year of the reign of our gracious sovereign lord George by the grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland King. defender of the faith, and AD 1720 made between Christopher Dodgson of Ellingthorpe Grange in the parish of Gisburn in the country of York yeoman and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and William Dodgson of Ellingthorpe Grange aforesaid third son of the said Christopher Dodgson of the other part of or concerning all that messuage or dwelling house commonly called and known by the name of Woosen Gap together with all and singular houses, outhouses, edifices, barns, buildings, orchards, gardens, and backsides thereunto belonging. And also all those several closes of arable land, meadow and pasture called and known by the several names of the Carhamsike, Carham End, and the Carhams, formerly divided into two closes the Bickersber's, the Lower Lofterann with one barn or laithe therein standing, the Higher Lofterann and Wheat Lofterann, Hewitt Lofterann, the Mour Close formerly divided into five, several closes and the Jufield all which said premises are situate, lying and being within the township, town fields, permits and territories of Paythorne in the parish of Gisburn and formely purchased and taken in exchange of James Browne, Thomas 

#### Will of Christopher Dodgson 1728

In the name of God Amen. I, Christopher Dodgson of Ellingthorpe Grange in the parish of Gisburn and county of York yeoman being of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner and form following that is to say Imprimis my will and mind is that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be paid out of my personal estate by my executor hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth all my household goods to have give dispose of or sell the same as to her shall seem meet and convenient. Item. I give and bequeath to my third son William all my husbandry gear. I having heretofore given to my eldest son Robert a full half part out of the same which he has already had and received. Item. I give and bequeath to my said wife Elizabeth all the mean profits of all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal for and during the time and term of her natural life, Item. My will and mind that all the just debts and funeral expenses of my said wife Elizabeth (in case she should outlive me) shall be paid out of my said personal estate by my said executors, provided that the mean profits of my estate above bequeathed to my said wife Elizabeth shall not extend to defray the same. Item. I give and bequeath to my eldest son Robert the sum of £10 nevertheless on condition that he behave himself quietly and peaceably towards my said wife and likewise towards all his brothers and sisters and that he give no disturbance to them or any of them as to for touching or concerning anything by this will or otherwise heretofore by me given sold aliened or enfeoffed to them or any of them and that he give such security in writing under his hand and seal so to behave himself as they or any of them or their council learned in the law shall judge to be requisite or necessary. But if my said son Robert shall not behave himself according to this my will and mind or shall refuse to give such security as here is specified my will and mind is and I do hereby give and bequeath unto him my said son Robert 1 shilling only. And I do further order and appoint that then the said sum of 10 pounds shall go towards and be expended in maintaining such troubles suits or actions as he the said Robert shall commence against them or any of them touching the premises or anything by this my said will ordered or anything heretofore by my sold given or disposed. Item I give and bequeath unto William Oddie my son-in-law the sum of £5 for and in consideration of his trouble about two children of my late son-in-law Joshua Blezard. Item I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Margaret wife of the said William Oddie the sum of £15. Item I give and bequeath to my second daughter Helen wife of William Lancaster the sum of £5. Item I give and bequeath unto my youngest daughter Mary now wife of Thomas Brennand the sum of £5. Item I give and bequeath to my youngest son William above said the sum of £15. and my will and mind is that the legacies above bequeathed to my said wife Eizabeth and likewise the legacy of my husbandry gear shall take place immediately after my decease. But that all the rest of my said legacies shall take place

accordingly shall be paid by my said executor as above specified within the space of one

And my will and mind further is that from and after the decease of myself and of my said wife Elizabeth that is to say after the decease of the longer liver of us all my estate at Ellingthorpe Grange which I purchased off Francis Lister Clarke and which is now in the occupation of my third son William together with all the edifices, lands, and all other appurtenances belonging to the same shall come descend and be given and accordingly I do hereby give devise and bequeath the same to my second son Christopher and to his heirs and assigns for ever. And lastly all the rest and residue of my estate whether real or personal goods cattels or chattles bills bonds and ready money whatsoever or wheresoever not herein or hereby given or disposed I give and bequeath to my second son Christopher and to his heirs and assigns for ever. And I do also make ordain nominate and appoint him my said second son Christopher sole executor of this my last will and testament revoking and disanulling all wills by me at anytime heretofore made. In witness whereof the said Christopher Dodgson have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of February in the year of Our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and twenty eight.

#### Notes for Christopher Dodgson:

There is no will as such left by Christopher but at the Borthwick Institute there is an admon which is fairly limited. In the parish registers of Gargrave where Christopher was vicar for many years the vicar who replaced him bemoans the fact that Christopher had been given large sums of money to repair and update the vicarage but had not spent a penny. Further even though Christopher had died the vicar says he has seen none of this money. Christopher's widow, Dorothy, a descendant of the Fountain family of Linton in Craven had sppedily left Gargrave for Skipton, no doudt with the repair money!! There are various memorials relating to her and the sale of property after this. One in Hellifield and two in Long Preston. These highlight that she had at some point moved to Kirkby Lonsdale in what was Westmoreland and then from there to Lancaster and then Leeds where one Christopher Fountain also mentioned in one of the memorials and probably her brother is described as a woollen draper. The references at Wakefield are RR 700 932, TT 523 676, TT 524 677, AU 236 316. The witnessesd to the Hellifield and Long Preston sales to Stephen Hammerton were Thomas Jenkinson of Kirkby Lonsdale gentleman, Lawrence Carr of Settle yeoman and Edward Salisbury of Newton gentleman. The later sale was witnessed by Christopher Fountain of Leeds woollen draper James Donaldson of Leeds grocer and Ann Jagger of Leeds spinster. A fuller memorial EE 597 874 made after the will of Christopher senior follows:

I consign my sole to my gracious and all merciful maker, humbly imploring his pardon for the transgressions of my life and trusting that by repentance through the of my Saviour I may be made partaker of everlasting and earnestly beseech my beloved wife Lucy Dodgson not to suffer herself to grieve immoderately for my death but to look upon our dear children the pledges of our affections as still uniting us and by continuing her maternal love to them to consider that she is thereby in the best manner cherishing my memory. Should she marry again which far be it from me to wish to restrain her from if she finds a man worthy of her (a heart more warmly attached to her than that which dictates these lines she never can find), I request her to consider the interests of our dear children aforesaid in securing for them the little property she and they derive from me that they may not suffer from the caprice which sometimes influences the best of men and which is not infrequently observed in the conduct of a man to the children of his wife by a former marriage. After the payment of my just debts, I leave the whole of my property to my beloved wife aforesaid for her natural life and afterwards to my dear children and recommend to her most earnestly to consult in every transaction her worthy and good father whose affection and advice I feel she may rely on as a secure Guide.

### Notes for MARY ANN HARRISON:

Mary Ann Harrison was born on the 26th October 1846 at five past one in the morning at the family home - 103, Grimshaw Park, Blackburn. She was baptised later that same day at the parish church in Blackburn, St. Mary the Virgin. Mary Ann was a twin, her twin sister, Susannah was also baptised on that day but does not appear to have survived. Mary Ann was the daughter of William Harrison who was a mechanic and his wife Ellen, nee Haworth. William signed to register the birth on the 16th of November that year. Her father William had been born around 1813 in Chorley. He was the son of Thomas and Mary Harrison. William worked as a mechanic - a skill that would be very prized and highly valued given the increasingly complex machinery that was brought in as the industrial revolution gathered momentum. It was also a skill that was to be passed on to other family members. Ellen was born in Blackburn around 1816. She worked as a cotton weaver

William and Ellen had several other children. The eldest child listed in the census returns for Blackburn is their son John who was born in Blackburn around 1838. By 1851, John was still listed as a scholar. By 1861, when the family had moved to 6, Clayton St, a grocer's shop, he was listed as a mechanic like his

father. By 1881 John had moved to Preston where he was living with his wife Margaret Ann who had been born in Hull. They were living at 1 and 2 Lord's Walk. I wonder if that too was a shop? Five sons were living with them - Doctor aged 11 and born in Blackburn, John and Frederick aged 9 and 5 respectively and both born in Withnell, and Thomas and Charles aged 3 and 10 months respectively and both born in Preston. Also living with them was John's mother, Ellen, now a widow.

William and Ellen's next oldest child in the census returns is William born 1843 in Blackburn. A scholar in 1851, he is listed as an 18 year old moulder in 1861. I believe that he was subsequently to leave Blackburn and that he is the person listed in the 1881 census living at 452, Warrington Rd Ince in Makerfield, where his occupation is listed as fruiter and iron moulder, no doubt carrying on the Harrison entrepreneurial dynasty. His wife is 31 year old Isabella born in Cockerham. Two children are listed - six year old Thomas born in Lancaster, and three year old Lucy born in Abram

The next child of William and Ellen is listed as Thomas who was born in Blackburn around 1845. A scholar in 1851 he is listed as a cotton weaver in 1861.

After Mary Ann the next of Wiiliam and Ellen's children is listed as Susannah born around 1849 again in Blackburn. By 1861 she was listed as a cotton weaver. No Susannah Harrison of the appropriate age appears on the 1881 census returns for Lancashire. It could be that she had moved but more likely I think she would have married or possible even died.

Ellen born around 1857 in Blackburn is the final child of the marriage listed on early census returns. Mary Ann's father William was one of several children of Thomas and Mary Harrison nee Kenyon, who had married in the parish church in Chorley on the 23rd July 1807. Thomas had been born in Thornton in Craven in Yorkshire and he was baptised in the parish church there on the 2nd of November 1777, the son of Elisha and Susannah Harrison. He had worked as a cotton spinner and then at one had run a business known as Houghton and Harrison. After that he ran Harrison's Public House at the bottom of Grimshaw Park for many years. I believe this pub became known as The Good Samaritan and may have stayed within the family - certainly one Ellen Harrison was running it in 1871. Thomas' wife Mary had been born around 1783. I have not checked parish registers so I don't have full details of their children, just those listed on census returns or on the family gravestone. I feel sure there must have been some older children whose details I don't yet have. The family grave stone lists four children who died quite early -Elisha their son who had been baptised in Chorley on the 26th of March 1815 and who died on September 2nd 1821, Nancy their daughter who died exactly one week later aged 2, a second Nancy who died on July 28th 1827 aged 11 months, and finally their son John who died on September 10th 1834 aged 25. The 1841 census records two other children - Thomas, and Elisha. Also listed living there is Mary, the widow of son John, and Mary and John's two children Richard, who was born on the 26th of September 1832 and baptised on the 25th of November 1832, and Nancy. Finally, listed as 15, comes Ann Harrison who is described as a servant. Whether she is a relative is not clear.

Thomas' wife Mary died on the 22nd October 1844 at the family home in Grimshaw Park. The cause of death is listed as inflamation of the chest. She is described as the wife of Thomas Harrison, an inn keeper. Thomas who had been present at the death registered the sad event. By 1851, Thomas was living at 60, Clayton St, where he is listed as a 74 year old widower whose occupation is given as "owner of houses". Living with him was his son Thomas, a 28 year old mechanic.. By 1861 Thomas and his son had moved to 25B Jackcroft, Thomas snr. listed as a Gentleman, his son as a machinist.

Thomas' son Elisha had by this time been married, widowed and left with a young son Richard. By 1861 Elisha and his son had moved to live with his brother William at the grocer's shop in Clayton St. By 1881 Elisha had moved to 5 Egbert St in Preston. He is listed as a mechanic model maker. I wonder if his home was also a shop where he sold his models? He had remarried to Agnes who had been born in 1834 in Kendal and who was a cotton winder. Nineteen year old James who had been born in Blackburn was listed as an apprentice model maker

Thomas' grandson Richard had by 1861 moved to 6, Pitt St. where he was living with his wife Margaret and one month old daughter Nancy. Richard was listed as a mechanic - the Harrisons held the corner on this in Blackburn!! Richard's wife Margaret had been born in Blackburn around 1838. By 1871, the family had moved to 22, Howard St., presumably a public house since Richard is listed as a beerseller and mechanic. Nancy was by now a scholar and she had three younger siblings - John aged 5, Mary aged 3, and 2 month old William.

Thomas Harrison sadly died on April 21st 1863 at his home, Jackcroft. His son Thomas of the same address who had been present at the death was the informant. The cause of death is listed as chronic bronchitis He was buried with his wife Mary and four of their children in the churchyard of what was St John's in Blackburn. The gravestone is still there on the James St side of the churchyard just across the road from what is now Keith Brown accountants. The stone reads as follows

Sacred to the memory of THOMAS HARRISON who departed this life April 21st 1863 aged 86 years, also MARY the wife of Thomas Harrison who departed this life October 22nd 1844 aged 61 years, also ELISHA the son of Thos and MARY Harrison of Blackburn. Innkeeper, who departed this life September

2nd 1821 in the 7th year of his age, also of NANCY their daughter who departed this life September 9th 1821 in the second year of her age, also of NANCY their daughter who departed this life July 28th 1827 aged 11 months, likewise of JOHN their son who departed this life September 10th 1834 in the 25th year of his age
